Historical Roots of Identity of Contemporary Slavs

Both stationary and online sessions are planned. The sessions will be held at the UZ on 29-30.09. 2023.

Slavs, both those living in their countries and living outside them, remain an important group both in Europe and among all nations identifying themselves with the broadly understood civilization of the West, looking for their roots in the symbolically perceived centers of Jerusalem, Athens and Rome. The Slavs have their undoubted share in creating this civilization, first of all, by bringing to it a specific element that enriches the mosaic, which consists of Romance, Germanic, Anglo-Saxon elements and all other elements present in the civilization of the West. It is this specific and in many respects non-homogeneous specificity of the Slavs that determines the richness of the influence of their culture on the civilization of the West. Returning to the sources is not only restoring the cultural memory of the extremely complex and complicated history of the Slavs, but above all discovering the phenomenon of persisting in cultural identity in a politically, ethnically and culturally complex world. Durations, which consisted of dramatic choices with tragic or heroic consequences. The specific geopolitical location of the Slavic countries meant that for centuries their inhabitants lived on the border of dynamic: military, political, religious and cultural influences of other countries, which often chose the path of domination as the only legitimate one. The study of the mechanisms that allow the preservation of the cultural identity of the Slavs in such a complicated reality allows not only to understand the cultural economy itself, which combines what is familiar, but also accepts and often processes what is foreign or radically rejects it. Leaning over the historical roots of Slavic identity may allow an attempt to understand the entire paradigm of attitudes, values, religions related to the

ethnos being a "living organism" in the melting pot of history and politics. Such studies can bring many very interesting aspects to further study of the phenomenon of the cultural identity of the Slavs, although not only in the times of postmodernity, globalization, McDonaldization of mass culture, which seem to be no less of a challenge than the experiences of past eras.

The conference is dedicated not only to Slavicists, folklorists, historians or political scientists, but also to religion experts, theologians and culture experts, as well as to all researchers who find the research subject proposed by the organizers interesting.
